APPLICATIONS

- ideal for restoration of historic monuments to match the historic originals
- for producing smooth or skimmed wall and ceiling surfaces
- for interior and external use

PROPERTIES

- mineral
- optimised hardening and reduced risk of efflorescence by using original tubag trass
- good workability
- vapour-permeable
- moisture regulating
- treated areas can be painted and wallpapered

COMPOSITION

- highly hydraulic trass lime according to DIN EN 459-1
- Minimal white cement content as binder according to DIN EN 197-1
- selected fine marble powder

SUBSTRATE

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| Suitable substrates | <ul style="list-style-type: none">■ Trass lime or lime cement base plasters■ old load-bearing, cement-bonded plasters, unpainted■ Concrete■ Not suitable for subsurfaces containing gypsum |
| Properties/tests | <ul style="list-style-type: none">■ The subsurface must be even, dry, clean, load-bearing, absorbent and free of adhesion impairing residues, efflorescence and sinter skins.■ For assessing the plaster primer, VOB/C DIN 18350, Section 3, DIN EN 13914-1/13914-2 as well as the plaster standard DIN 18550-1/18550-2 should be observed.■ The plaster primer must not be painted or coated in another form. |
| Pretreatment | <ul style="list-style-type: none">■ Highly absorbent substrates are to be pre-treated. |

PROCESSING

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| Temperature | <ul style="list-style-type: none">■ Do not process or allow to dry out at air, material or substrate temperatures below +5°C, or if there is a risk of exposure to night frost, or at temperatures above +30°C, or in direct sunlight, or on heated up surfaces, and/or in windy conditions. |
| Mixing / Preparation / Processing | <ul style="list-style-type: none">■ When mixing manually, first place the quantity of water specified in the technical data in a clean container and then sprinkle in dry mortar. Use clean tap water.■ use a suitable agitator to mix the material until smooth and free of lumps. Leave to rest for a moment and then mix again, adding more water, if required, to achieve the right consistency for applying.■ Do not mix with other products and/or other substances. |
| Processing | <ul style="list-style-type: none">■ Apply material with a trowel approx. 2 to 3 mm thick, dampen slightly after a rest time of approx. 5 to 10 minutes and felt off with the sponge float.■ To produce smoothed surfaces, smooth off the applied mortar after felting. |
| Processing / Working time | <ul style="list-style-type: none">■ Approximately 1 hour■ The stated times apply for a temperature of +20°C and relative humidity of 65%.■ Mortar that has already started to harden must never be thinned down with additional water, remixed or applied. |
| Drying / Hardening | <ul style="list-style-type: none">■ Protect the fresh mortar from drying out too quickly and from unfavourable weather conditions such as frost, draughts, direct sunlight and direct exposure to driving rain if necessary by hanging with foil. |
| Cleaning the tools | <ul style="list-style-type: none">■ Clean all tools and equipment with water immediately after use. |
| Notes | <ul style="list-style-type: none">■ All relevant implementing standards and regulations shall be taken into account. |

PACKAGING

- 25 kg/sack

STORAGE

- Store sacks appropriately and in dry conditions on pallets.

- consumption: approx. 4.0 kg/m² at 3 mm plaster thickness
